Lesson 2- The Giant Slayer



This page lets you know what your child learned in Kids Church today. In addition, you will find this week's memory verse, a suggested activity, and a short prayer to reinforce the lesson. Being involved and interacting with your child can be very rewarding for both of you.



What we learned:

In today's lesson, the children learned that it is best not to rely solely on our own strength, to defeat the giants in their lives. Rather we should trust in and rely on God—for He will never fail us. Today we read how God enabled David to be brave in the face of danger and use something as small as a pebble to defeat something as large as a giant. (Scripture used: 1 Samuel 17:1-50)

Memory Verses:



"Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you." **Deuteronomy 31:6 NIV**

Read this verse each night this week with your child. Discuss one section of the verse each night, explain what it means to be on your guard, stand firm in the faith, be men and women of courage and stand strong.

Discussion Questions:



1. What was David's main task as a young man? (*Watch over his father's sheep.*)
2. Was protecting the sheep a dangerous job? Why? (*Lions and bears would attack the sheep.*)
3. Who gave David the courage to protect the sheep? (*God.*)
4. Why did David want to kill Goliath? (*He defied God and God's army.*)
5. What does the word defy mean? (*To resist, challenge, or mock.*)
6. Why might the other men have been scared of the giant? (*They relied on their own strength, not on God.*)
7. We all will face giant problems in our lives. What giants have you defeated with God's help?

Suggested Parent/Child Activity:



Although we may not face a real giant like David, each of us have giants in our lives that torment us. Small problems can seem larger than life to a young person. Ask your child to share any struggles that they may be going through and then pray, asking God to help defeat these problems just as He defeated David's giant.

Dear Lord, we are thankful that You provide solutions to our problems. Please give us the wisdom we need to trust your solutions and move forward in victory. Amen
