Now think about Jesus, how can you show love for Him and praise Him? Write down words/ draw pictures of praise.


The Last Supper

He then took some bread and again thanked God for it. He broke off some pieces, gave them to the disciples and said, 'this is my body that I am giving for you. Eat this to remember me.'



Jesus knew that he was soon going to die and that bread and wine would be symbols for his followers to remember him and his death.

The night before Jesus died, He went with his disciples to an olive garden nearby. It was called Gethsemane. He asked Peter, James and John to stay with him and watch while he prayed.

Jesus asked God to help him. He knew that soon all his friends would leave him, that he would be very alone and that He was going to suffer and die.



He cried out to God in anguish, asking Him to take the cup of suffering away from Him.

But then He added, "Not my will, but yours be done."
